OVERVIEW

This exhibit showcases a unique collection of maxicards that were created to demonstrate global support for Ukraine, featuring specially selected stamps and postmarks from 24 different countries, with the stamp image carefully matched to the image of the postcard.

Starting 24 February 2022, Russia's invasion of Ukraine resulted in a major escalation of the Russo-Ukrainian War, which began in 2014. In response to Europe's largest refugee crisis since World War II, up until mid-August 2022, the official postal agencies of 11 countries have issued special stamps to manifest their support and/or to raise funds for Ukraine. These countries are, in order of stamp release: Latvia (10 March), Estonia (24 March), Poland (25 March), Austria (31 March), Croatia (12 April), Moldova (19 April), Lithuania (6 May), Luxembourg (11 May), Spain (29 May), France (23 June) and Canada (7 July). Each of these stamps incorporates into its design the blue and yellow colours of Ukraine's flag more or less prominently.

In response to the ongoing conflict in Ukraine, we – a group of collectors and stamp enthusiasts from around the world – collaborated to create maxicards that are truly special and historically significant by combining postcards, stamps, and postmarks in a way that celebrates Ukraine and its people. We began our journey by designing the postcard that would serve as the vehicle onto which later philatelic elements would be added. Its image is based on a photograph taken by the organiser, Linda, which shows an orderly composition with equal parts shared by the cloudless sky and a canola field in Prince Edward Island, Canada. To invite people from countries which didn't issue a special Ukraine support stamp listed previously to participate, we found a creative way of substituting it with a stamp of sunflower / yellow flower to pay tribute to Ukraine as an independent, democratic nation. Lastly, we asked participants from around the world to add their own touch by visiting their local post office to obtain a postmark on the 24th of August – Ukraine's national day.

As our project grew and gained momentum on social media, we were overwhelmed by the outpouring of support and interest from people around the world. From Australia to Austria, from Canada to Croatia, from Japan to Spain, and beyond – people from over 20 countries have participated in our project, each adding their country's stamp and postmark to our collection of maxicards. The result is a unique and visually stunning collection of postcards that embody the theme of global solidarity.

This collection is not only a testament to the power of philately to unite different individuals across borders and cultures, but also a practical demonstration of the impact that can be achieved through collaboration. All proceeds from the auction of these maxicards will be donated to Ukraine relief funds, making a real difference to those affected by the ongoing conflict. In times of division, it is heartening to see the power of philately to bring people together in support of a common cause.

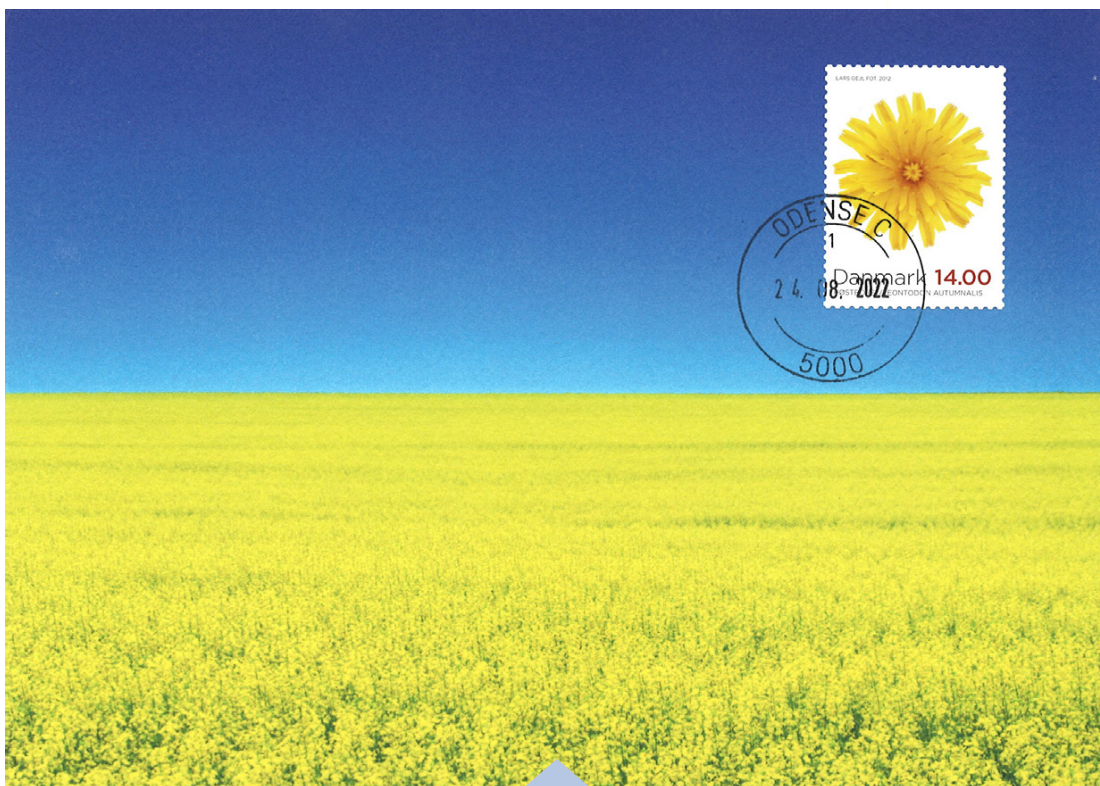

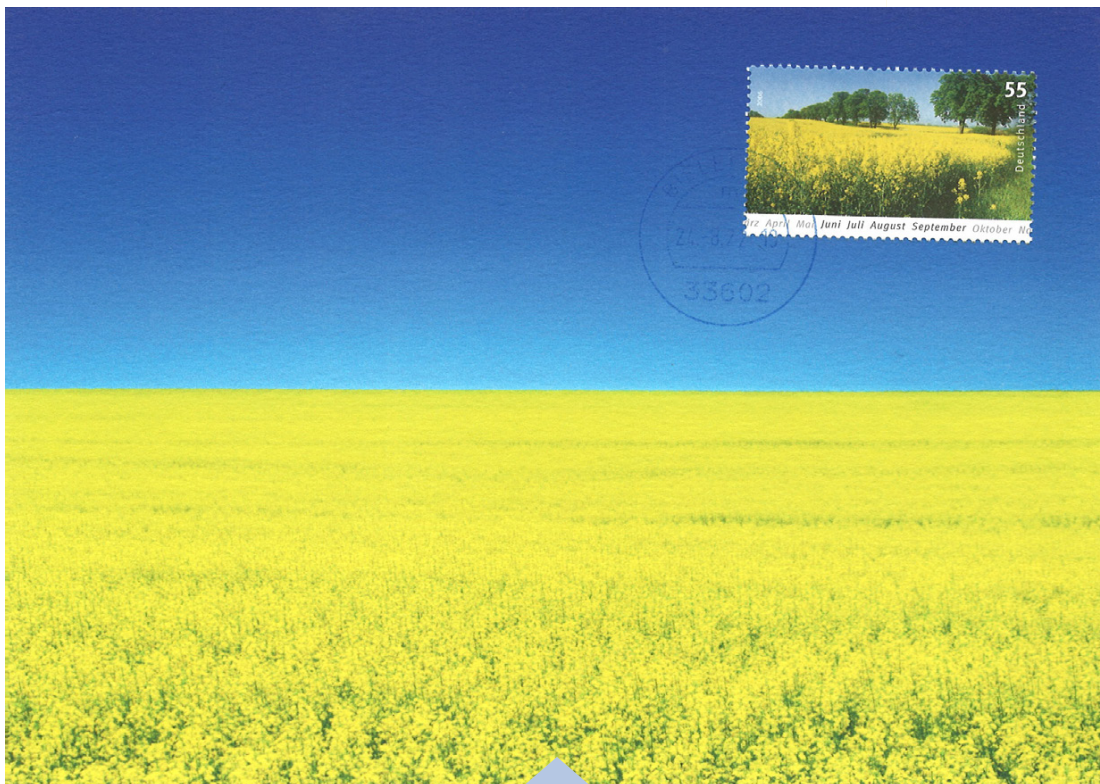

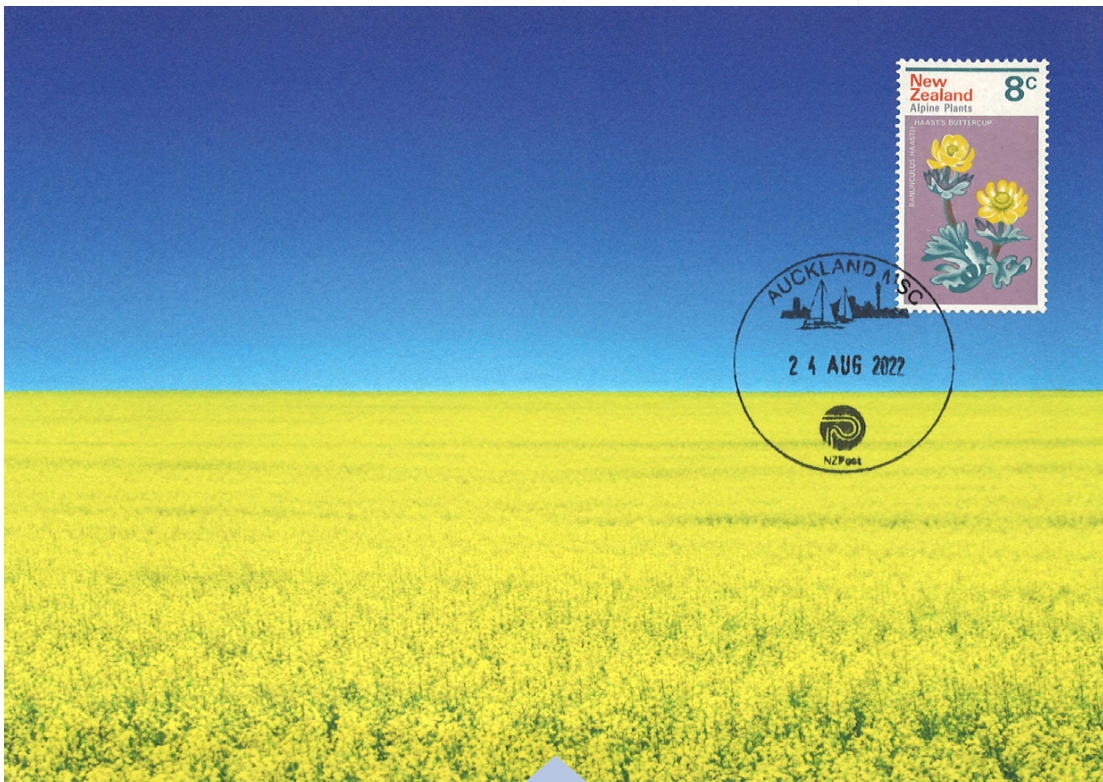

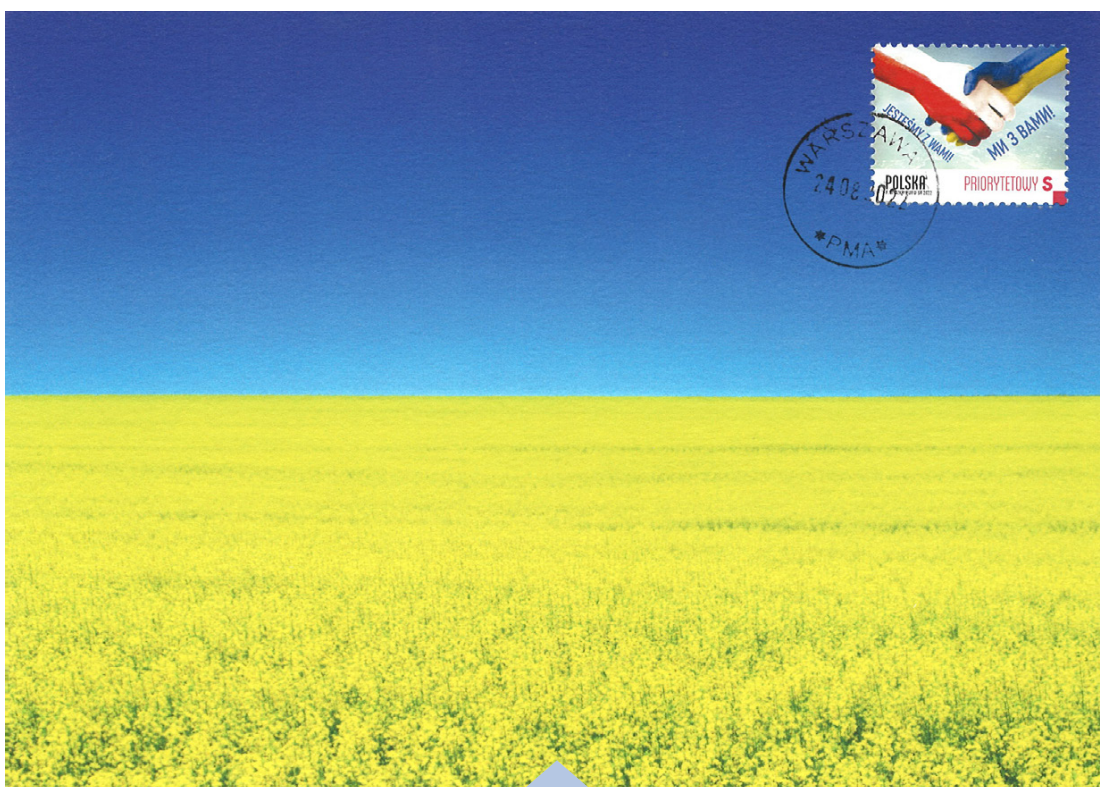

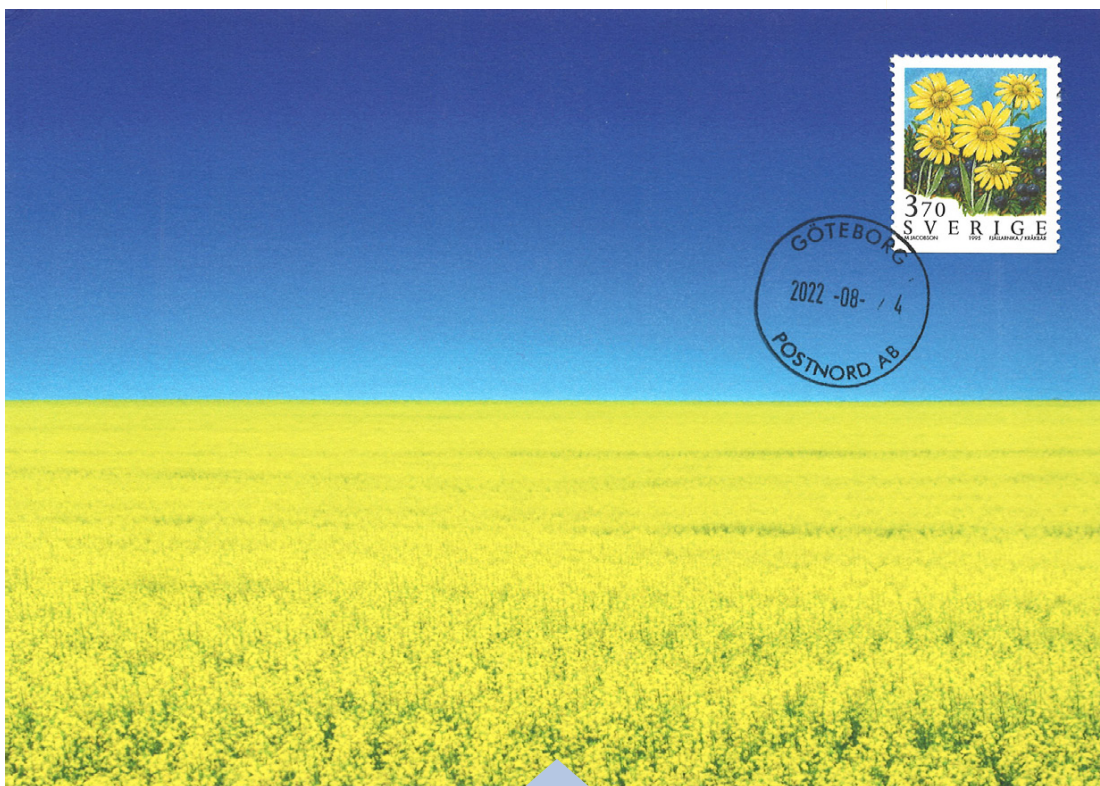

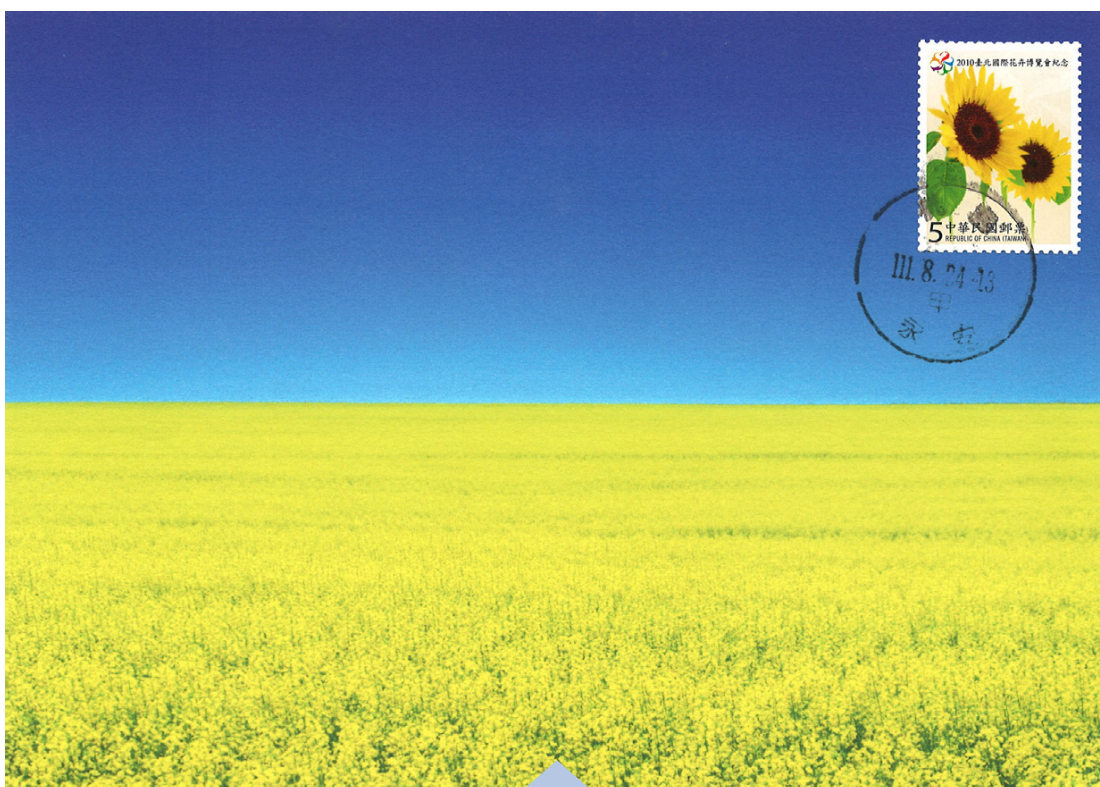

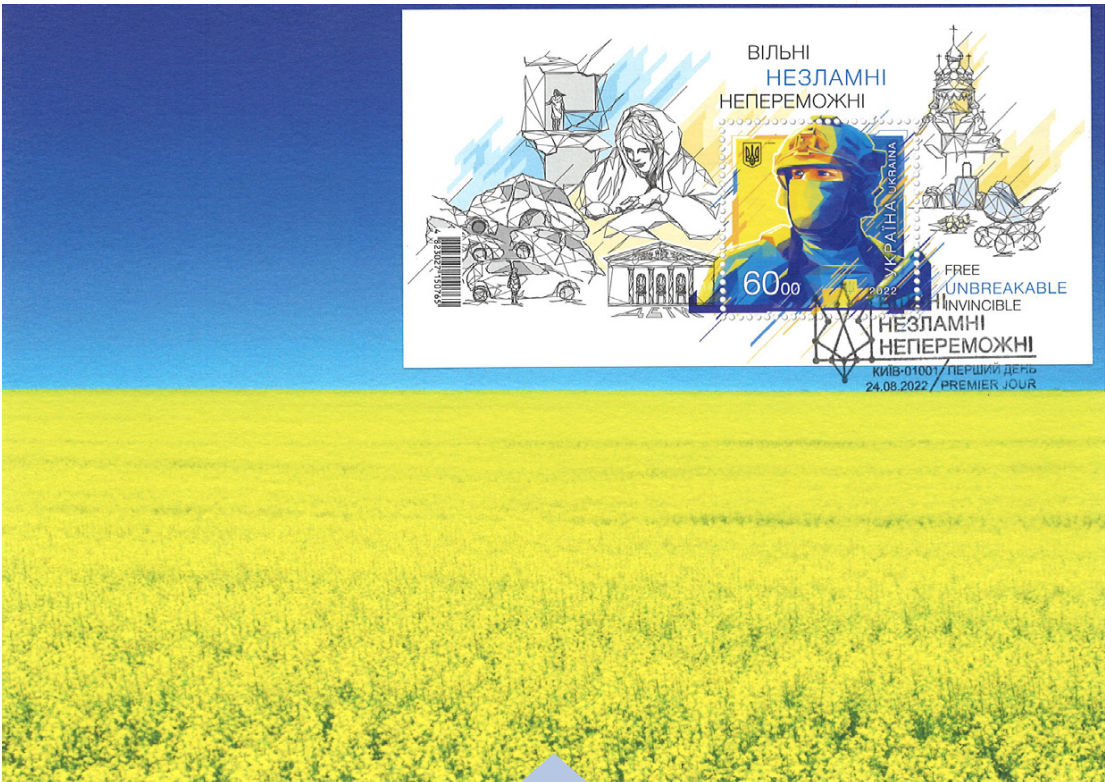

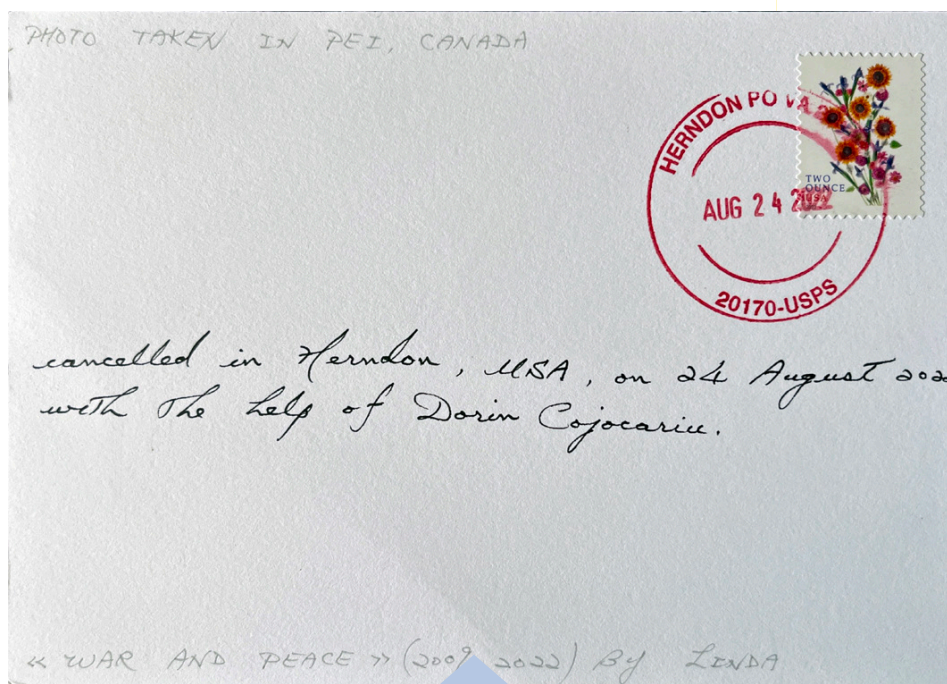

Where X is the city/town/village's name where the cancellation was applied, Y is the country's name, and Z refers to the project participant who brought the cards to the post office for cancellation.
